Q1) What is an adjective?

Ans) An adjective is a word which modifies noun and pronoun.

Q2) Define adjectives of quality?

Ans) Adjectives which tell us of what kind of person or thing is are called Adjectives of quality. Adjectives of quality answer the question 'of what kind?'

Q3) Define adjectives of quantity/ number.

Ans. Adjectives which tell us how many or how much are called adjectives of quantity or number. They answered the question 'how many ?'or 'how much?'

Q4) Define demonstrative adjective.

Ans. Adjectives that are used to modify a noun so that we know which specific person, place or thing is mentioned are called demonstrative adjective. They answer the question 'which?' Q5) Define interrogative adjective.

Ans. Interrogative adjectives are adjectives that are used with nouns to ask questions such as what, whose, where and which. Q6) Define possessive adjectives.

Ans. Possessive adjectives refer to words which modify noun by giving a sense of belonging to a particular person or thing. They tell 'whose' a thing is.
