Ans.4 About 40% of insect species have so far been identified in the Amazon.

5. Where is the bulk of the human population in the Amazon Basin found?

Ans.5 The bulk of the human population in the Amazon Basin is found in cities which have emerged from the surrounding rainforest to become significant population centres.
